Approval of Minutes:

Seymour: The minutes from October 5, 2009 meeting were approved with corrections.

Noise Abatement:

Carter: Craig Sarver present for his community to address noise levels on power boats. He was informed that the members of the committee have reviewed the ordinance from other areas to see if there is anything different in theirs than ours. Mr. Sarver talked with the KIC Deputy Prosecutor Office and they recommended that a local ordinance be adopted to cover noise. He was told that we currently have a local ordinance. A discussion was held on what other type of options the city may have to decrease the noise levels. Chief Mitchell will get with the City Attorneys Office to check on possible reduction on speedy limits on the lake or other possible

alternatives such as limiting the location for speed, displacement, size of motions/engines. To be set for further discussion at the December meeting. All members to research and bring for discussion.

Proposed Park Ordinance Changes:

King: A brief discussion was held on Weapons in the Park, Gary will forward email from Kathleen Haagard on NRA Challenges. It was also mentioned that we may need to review beer gardens, etc, as a new rule change proposal 09-19 is to come before the legislation. Do we want to remove language about beer gardens from the ordinance? Mark recommends that it not be removed all together but does not approve of beer gardens at BL Days. Dave recommends that we hold off on any language changes until the legislative session are done then decide. Okay to move forward to the November 17th workshop for further discussion.

Emergency Plan:

Wakefield: Dave met with the faith based groups. Their assistance would be limited due to generators. We still need to look at sustainability issues and are looking at larger shelter opportunities then we are able to get National Support. However we still need local support groups for meals, place to get warm but not say overnight. Item to stay on the agenda and revisit later.

Towing Services:

Mitchell: Mike informed the committee that we no longer need to address. He has gotten ordinances from other cities to review and he has talked with Atlas Towing and there have been no new issues. Chiefs only concern is that we promote shop Bonney Lake; however other tow is outside the city limits. No further action at this time, Chief is to continue to monitor and revisit if needed.

800 MHz:

Mitchell: Is not operational yet, the infrastructure is in; put there is a problem with the generator during the testing. There is also a problem with the licensing and have to get authorizations to use from others, and then the testing can start. Chief wants to move

VHF by Ponderosa into new facility with an approximate cost of \$3,000.00 but the funds will come out of the drug fund.

Still looking at options, there may be another group from in Auburn when King County does away that may be interested the talks are not done with Puyallup and Sumner and there is a meeting on November 5th to talk. What happens if there is no Animal Control, what do we do?
