

Snow Removal SOP:

The Standard Operating Procedure for snow removal is as follows:

Notification:

Upon notification by the Police department, or a supervisor, the “on call” person shall call snow removal personnel according to the “Snow plow call list”. This list designates the order and shift each snow plow operator is assigned. It is important to call the snow removal crews in order, this ensures that the schedule can be maintained smoothly in the event of a long term operation. *“On Call” personnel will not serve as a plow operator outside of work hours.*

The snow plows will concentrate on State Route 410 as well as the Main Arterials at the start of any snow event. These routes are **“Priority Routes”** as they are considered the prime movers of high volume traffic throughout the City of Bonney Lake.

Snow removal procedures for State Route 410:

Snow plows will work in tandem to clear the eastbound and westbound lanes of SR-410 at the start of any snow event. Upon completion of SR-410, operators will work individually on the following Arterial streets:

High Volume Arterial streets off SR 410:

Sumner/Buckley Highway

Myers Road

184th Ave E/Sky Island Drive

192nd Ave E (Target Store/Wal-Mart)

South Prairie Road

214th Ave. E

233rd Ave. E

208th Ave E

Other “Main Arterial” and “Collector” streets:

Locust Avenue

Bonney Lake BLVD (Bonney Lake Elementary)

South Tapps Highway (Emerald Hills Elementary)

West Tapps Highway

Church Lake Road

Angeline Road

Panorama BLVD/176th Ave E.

192nd Ave E (Bonney Lake Manor)

104th St E (Bonney Lake High School)

200th Ave Ct E (Mt. View Middle School)

Procedure for “Local Access” streets:

The snow plows will sand intersections and steep inclines on “Local Access” streets following the completion of the main arterials and collectors. These streets exist primarily in home tracks or developments. Steep inclines will be sanded as soon as possible.
