1. Wastewater Pretreatment Program Presentation. Michael Kosa, City of Sumner Public Works Director and Andrea Hannegan from the City of Sumner.

Michael Kosa and Andrea Hannegan from the City of Sumner presented the joint Wastewater Pretreatment Program between the City of Sumner and the City of Bonney Lake. Wastewater Treatment Plants are designed to handle domestic waste. The Program will include non-domestic wastewater that goes to the Wastewater Treatment Plant, establishing a local presence that can assist businesses navigate the federal program as it applies to them. The Wastewater Treatment Plant is required to track non-domestic waste per the permit for the plant. The implementation plan is to

collect surveys to determine the level of engagement. The program will help identify where more pollution is entering the treatment plant making the plant more efficient.
