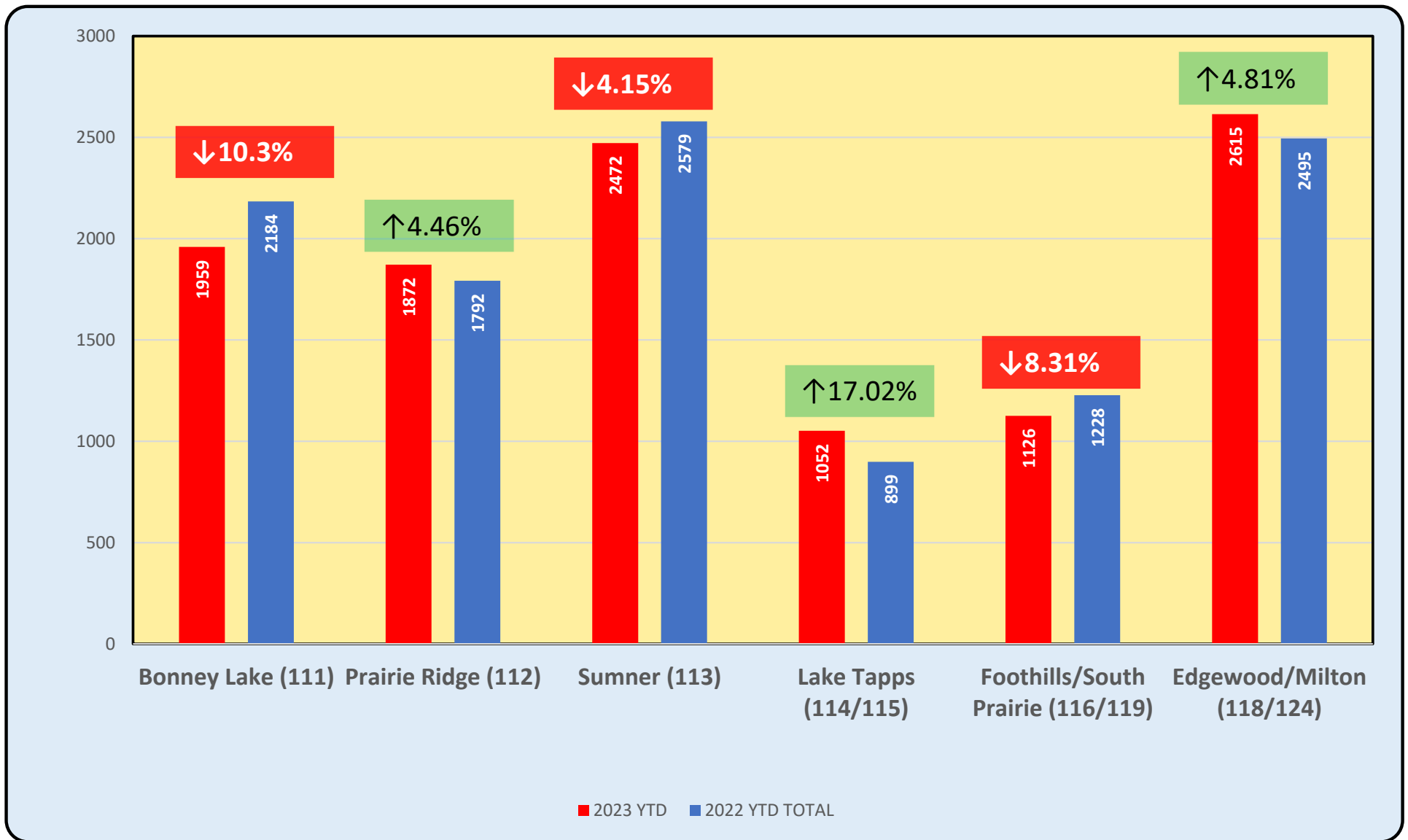

58 fewer calls YTD than YTD 2022 a decrease of 0.50%

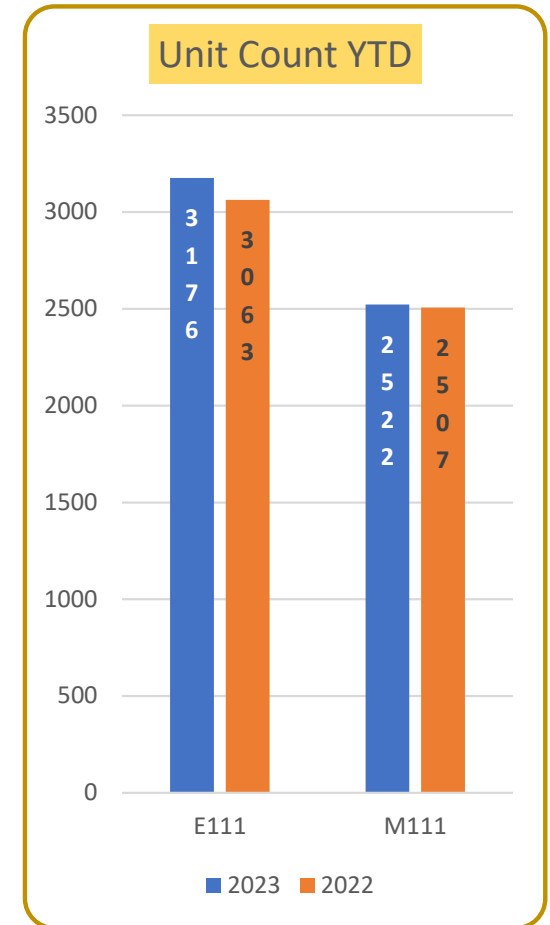

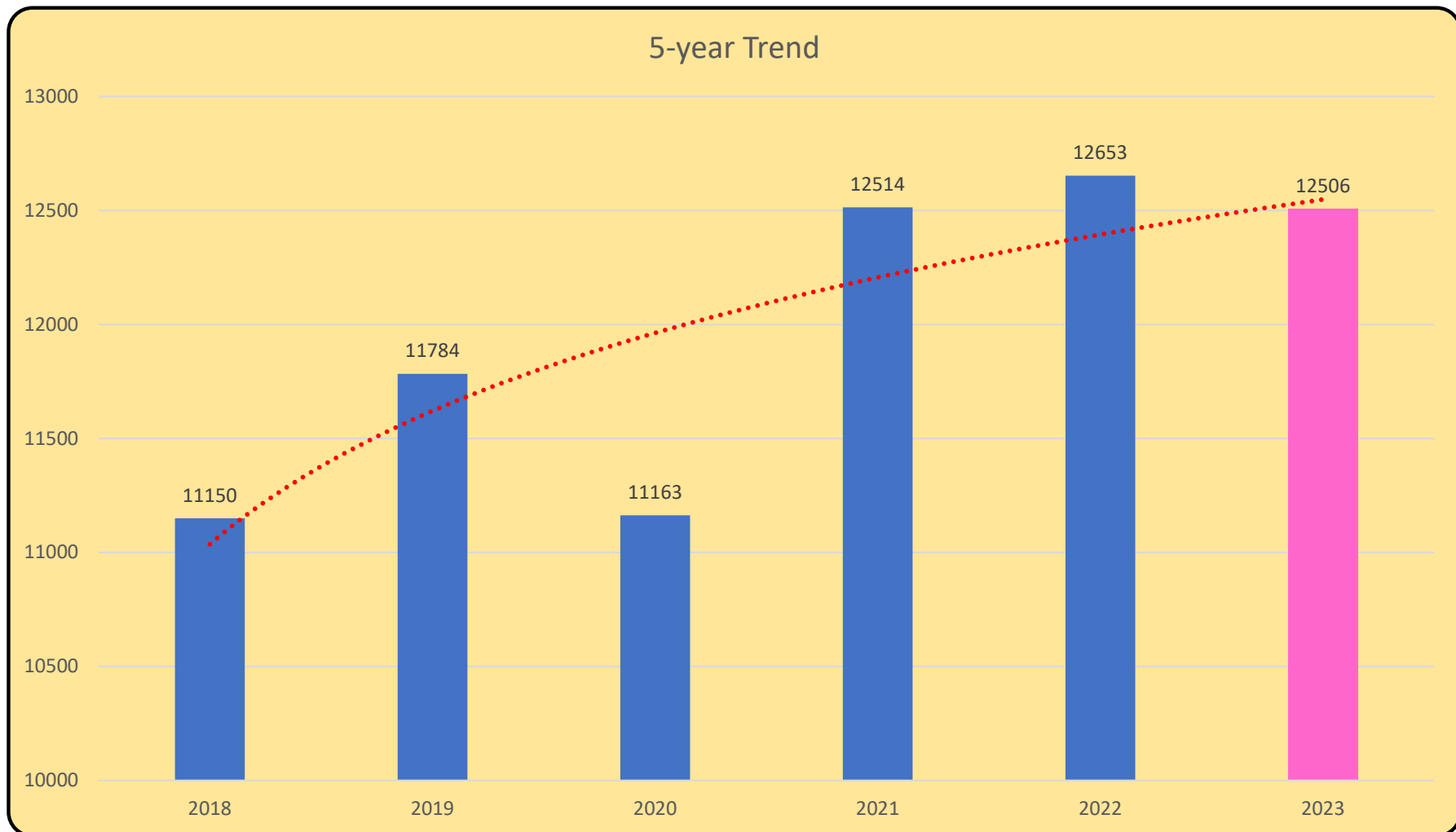

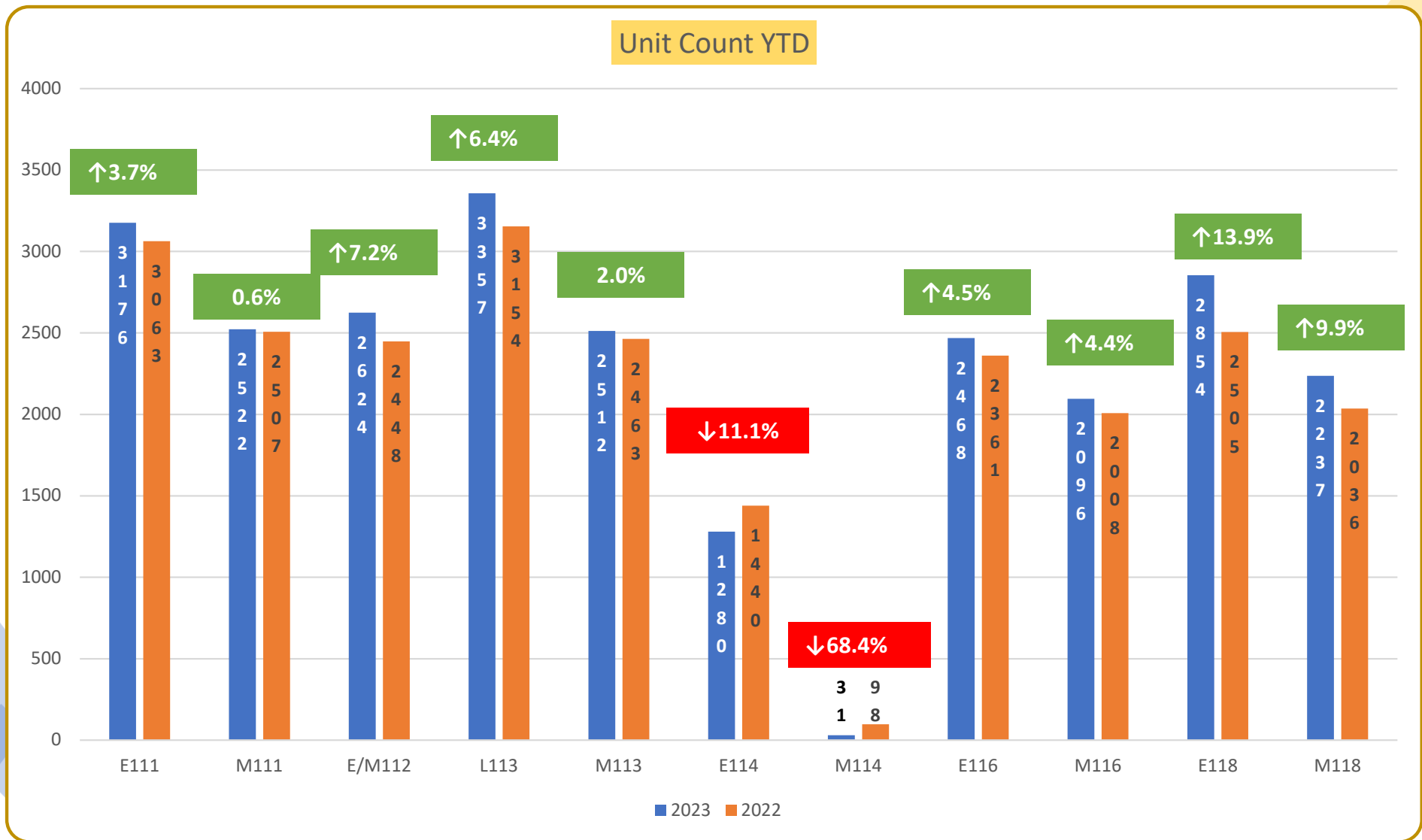

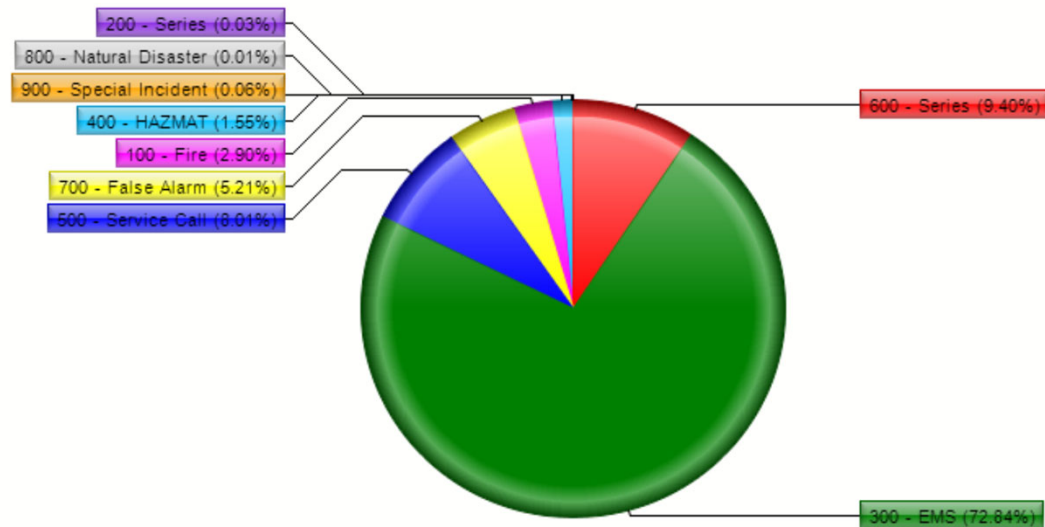


Total Counts by Unit—YTD Thru November 2023

PATROL ACTIVITY

October 30th—November 6th

Shoplift @ Home Depot – Loss Prevention called to report a male walked out with a bucket full of tools but dropped it when confronted. Area check completed. Unable to locate.

Vehicle Fire @ 19XXX State Route 410 E—RP reported his vehicle was on fire. Officers arrived to a partially engulfed engine compartment. Officers were able to extinguish the fire prior to EPFR arrival. EPFR evaluated the engine and found no hazards.

Threats @ BLHS—Two students threatened to bring guns to the school to handle a dispute between them. School was placed on modified lockdown. Both students were eventually located at their residences.

November 6th—November 13th

Attempted MVTR @ 9XXX 219th Ave E – Caller reported a juvenile male was possibly attempting to steal a vehicle from the 410 Auto Sales lot. Juvenile resided nearby and his parents arrived. Vehicle was unlocked with the keys in it. Business owner was contacted and advised he did not want to be a victim, just an information report.

Burglary @ 7XXX 214th Ave E—Owners reported they believed squatters are in the house. Officers confirmed it appears there may be squatters living inside as a dog could be heard barking from within and lights were on inside. Officers attempted to communicate with suspected occupants, but no one responded. Officers advised the owners that code enforcement has already been made aware and the house is not safe for officers to enter. Owners were advised to follow up with code enforcement on Monday and begin working through the civil eviction process with the county.

Shoplift/Recovered Runaway @ Walmart—Officers responded to a report of a shoplift that just occurred. Upon arrival, the two suspects were contacted and detained. It was determined that one of the suspects was an active runaway. She was cited and her guardian responded to pick her up. The other suspect was also cited and released at the scene due to her having two small children with her.

PATROL ACTIVITY Cont.

November 13th - November 20th

Theft in Progress @ Target—Loss Prevention reported two suspects inside the store with two carts full of merchandise and were walking towards a fire exit to a waiting vehicle. The vehicle had moved to the main parking lot prior to PD arrival and must have notified the subjects inside as they ditched the two carts near a fire exit and left. The two carts were found to have over \$4,000 of merchandise in them.

Welfare Check / Order Violation @ Red Robin—Caller reported a male slumped over in a vehicle in the Red Robin parking lot. Officers contacted the occupants, finding the male was extremely intoxicated and had to be transported to Good Samaritan Hospital. Records confirmed there was a No Contact Order between the occupants.

Disorderly/Fight @ BLHS – 5 students involved in a physical altercation. Mainly between two students, 4 other individuals jumped in to pull people off along with staff. Parents were contacted by school staff and report taken and forwarded to the JV prosecutor.

November 20th—November 27th

Agency Assist @ Winco – Sumner PD had a carjacking with shots fired at Winco with the suspects shooting at the victim's boyfriend in another vehicle following. Shortly after, Sumner received a call of an individual that had been shot in the face. A witness called stating they were following the stolen vehicle and possibly parked in a garage in the 5100 block of West Tapps Hwy E. The suspected residence was contacted by PSCO/ Sumner PD and no stolen vehicle was found. Investigation ongoing.

Commercial Burglary @ Chevron – Unknown subject broke the lock on the front door and stole large amounts of lottery tickets and cigarettes. Video footage showed W/M average height, baseball hat, black hoody, gray jacket, and tan pants. Fled toward Les Schwab Tires.

Commercial Burglary @ Safeway Fuel—Commercial alarm at the fuel station. Unknown suspect defeated the lock on the door and made off with all the scratch tickets and a few packs of cigarettes. Video obtained and determined the suspect was not wearing gloves. A piece of plastic the suspect touched was determined to have fingerprint evidence and was taken for further processing. Video review revealed very likely the same suspect that burglarized the Chevron in the above mentioned call.

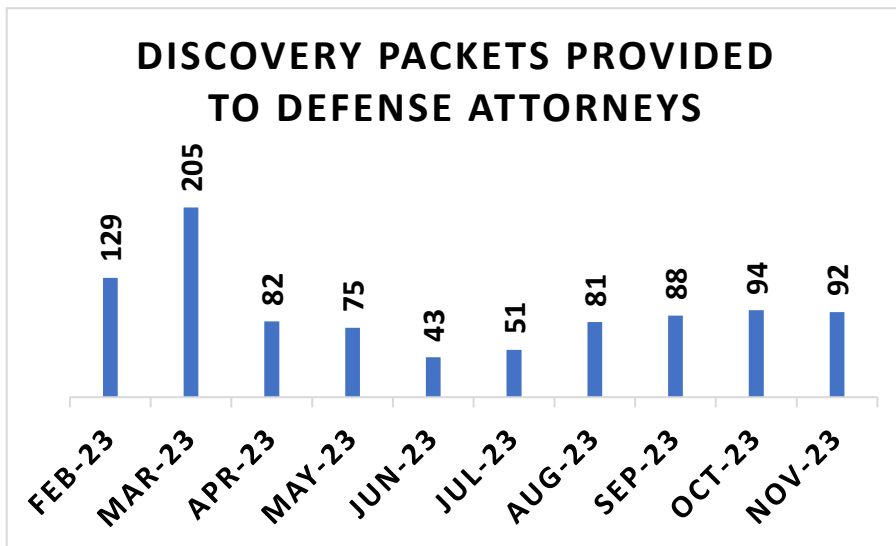
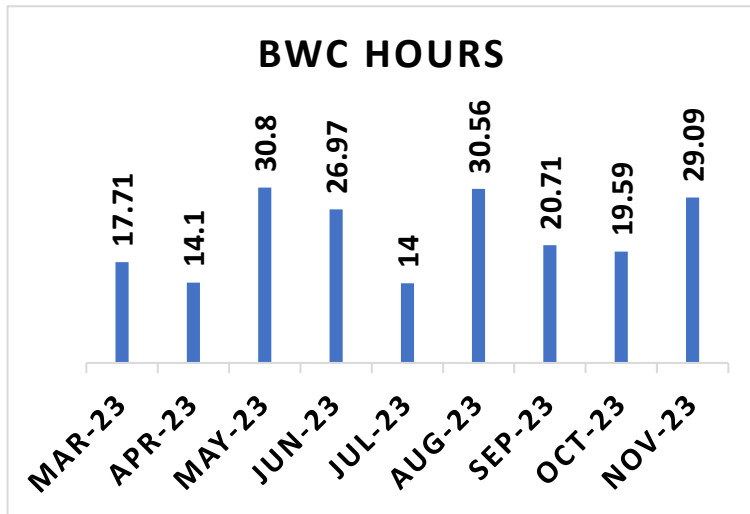
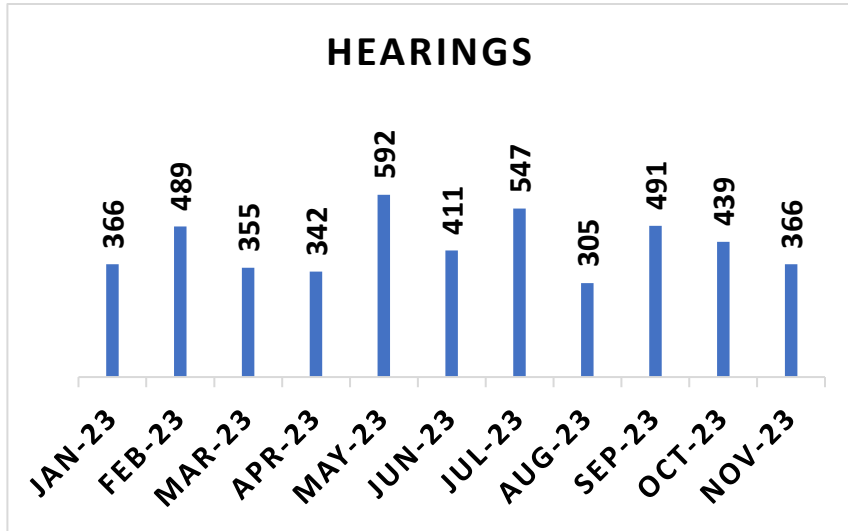

Updates

Staff viewed 29.09 hours of Body Worn Camera (BWC) video and provided 92 discovery packets to Defense.

We charged our first two cases under the new Drug Possession law – RCW 69.50.4013, adopted by BLMC 9.01.010.

Administrative Specialist Paul has been working with three high needs victims who have been actively communicating with her how terrified they are of the defendant. She is working with them daily to connect them to resources and help them remain safe.

The Prosecutor's Office is collaborating with the new Community Court Case Manager. Soon, Community Court Participants will be able to utilize Uber or Lyft via grant funds to gain access to transportation to and from drug and alcohol evaluation and treatment appointments. Additionally, we are working on revisions to the Community Court Policies and Procedures as we learn more about how to help Participants in this new approach to justice.

The Bonney Lake-Eatonville ILA for Court, Prosecution, and Public Defender services terminates on December 31, 2023. Eatonville plans to receive future services from Pierce County. Staff are working diligently on winding down and transitioning cases before the end of the year. On December 29, Prosecutor Candia will deliver remaining paper files to Eatonville. Administrative Specialist Paul is ensuring proper paperwork is loaded into electronic files before they are sent to Eatonville. Legal Specialist Visnaw is preparing and sending download links for all electronic files to Eatonville.

Full Title/Motion: An Ordinance Of The City Council Of The City Of Bonney Lake, Pierce County, Washington, Amending Bonney Lake Municipal Code Sections 6.04.190 And 6.04.230.

Administrative Recommendation: Approve

Background Summary: When local cities contracted with Metro Animal Services, they sought to create more uniform respective city codes for licensing and keeping of potentially dangerous and dangerous dogs in 2020. In doing so, the Bonney Lake Municipal Code was amended such that the portion of the code that pertained to animals at large was restricted to only animals at large in certain public areas.

As the Bonney Lake Municipal Code is currently written, only animals at large in public places are in violation. This is different from other cities that also contract with Metro Animal Services. The proposed amendment includes language that is the same or similar to the other cities and creates a more uniform code in the interest of community health, safety, and welfare.

At the November 14, 2023, Public Safety Committee Meeting, Councilmembers requested additional language be added to evince the legislative intent that the Prosecutor is encouraged to move for the Court to lower the fine owed in the interest of justice, such as, when it is an isolated incident for the animal/animal owner, the animal owner takes corrective action, an inquiry into the finances of the owner shows a hardship or inability to pay, or otherwise in the interests of justice. The recommended code change has been updated with this intent.

ORDINANCE NO. D23-152

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BONNEY LAKE, PIERCE COUNTY, WASHINGTON, AMENDING BONNEY LAKE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTIONS 6.04.190 AND 6.04.230

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to revise its code to more closely reflect that of other cities served by Metro Animal Services; and

WHEREAS, the current language of the code limits citing animals at large to only those animals that become at large in generally public places; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that this ordinance is in the interest of community health, safety and welfare,

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BONNEY LAKE, WASHINGTON HEREBY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 6.04.190 of the Bonney Lake Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

6.04.190 General Violations.

It shall be a violation of this chapter for any person or the owner of any animal to:

A. Permit any domesticated animal to become at large ~~whether licensed or not, in any park or on any public beach, pond, fountain, or stream therein, or upon any public playground or school ground;~~ provided, however, that this section shall not prohibit a person from walking or exercising a licensed animal in a public park or on any public beach, where permitted, when such animal is on a leash, tether or chain not to exceed eight feet in length. This section shall not apply to designated off-leash areas or a service animal if a leash would interfere with the service animal's work or the nature of the owner's or keeper's disability prevents use of a leash;

B. Permit any animal to be a nuisance;

C. Fail to keep any female dog or cat in heat confined in a building or secure enclosure in such a manner that such female dog or cat cannot come into contact with another animal except for planned breeding;

D. Fail to provide an animal with humane care and treatment and with sufficient and proper nutritional food for its species, sufficient water, proper shelter and protection from the weather, and veterinary care when needed to prevent suffering; and not amounting to animal cruelty under BLMC 6.04.140 or as defined in Chapter 16.52 RCW;

E. Leave an animal unattended for more than 24 consecutive hours without adequate care;

F. Abandon an animal;

G. Use any trap for the purpose of seizing domestic animals, except that humane traps may be used as approved by the discretion of the animal control officer for the purpose of capturing abandoned, at large and sick animals.

Section 2. Section 6.04.230 of the Bonney Lake Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows.

6.04.230 Violations – Penalties.

A. Unless otherwise specifically set forth herein, any person violating the provisions of this chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, except those persons who permit animals to become at large (BLMC 6.04.190(A)), permit animals to be a nuisance (BLMC 6.04.010(P) and 6.04.190(B)), fail to keep animal in heat confined (BLMC 6.04.190(D)),

fail to provide animal with humane care as defined in BLMC 6.04.190, or fail to have and provide rabies vaccination as defined in BLMC 6.04.250 have committed a Class 1 civil infraction pursuant to RCW 7.80.120.

Persons charged with infractions shall be processed by the municipal court in the same manner as persons charged with traffic infractions. Persons failing to appear for hearings for violations of this chapter shall be subject to the penalties set forth in BLMC 1.16.030. (Ord. 1642 § 1, 2020; Ord. 1352 § 1, 2010).

B. The Prosecutor is encouraged to lower the fine amount for Class 1 civil infractions under this Chapter as permitted under Washington State law when one or more of the following circumstances exists:

1. There is no history of a similar incident for the animal, animal owner, or person in control of the animal;
2. The person owning or in control of the animal takes corrective measures to prevent the animal to become at large in the future;
3. The person owning or in control of the animal provides an affidavit or sworn testimony to the court regarding a hardship or inability to pay the fine amount; or,
4. Other circumstances determined to be in the interest of justice.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and after its passage, approval and publication, as required by law.
